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A study by the U.S. Bureau of Health Professions found that nursing shortage will grow to more than 1.7 million RN by year 2020, while less than 635,000 will be available. In fact, the U.S. Department predicted by year 2012 RN will be the top occupation in terms of job growth.

An LPN degree takes less time than a RN education. Also it is less expensive. That allows people who are not able to spend three to four years in University to start a nursing career fast. But an LPN education is limited to job options and opportunities for advancement.

Many LPNs have expressed their willingness to go back to school to become an RN or BSN, but they don't have the time due to their need for a salary and family obligations. Now these same LPNs can make their dreams come true by pursuing their RN degree online. This is good for working moms and dads.

Online LPN To RN degree programs now make it possible for LPN's to continue their career while they pursue higher education. Working LPNs can earn an Associate degree in Nursing or Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree online while working at their own pace without disrupting their busy schedules and family obligations. LPNs can set their own hours and attend class in the comfort of their home or work, whenever it is convenient for them. An LPN pursuing an online LPN to RN degree or an LPN to BSN degree can complete virtually 100% of the course work from the privacy and conveniency of their home.

LPN to RN Degree Options:

Associate Degree in Nursing: That degree will allow someone to practice as a RN. A traditional campus based nursing program leading to an associate degree takes 2 to 3 years to complete, and graduates are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) and upon passing the test they can practice as a registered nurse. But ADN also has limitations. Now employers are looking more for Bachelors instead of Associate. A LPN to RN degree program can be completed in 18 months or less.

Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing (BSN Degree): Provides the basic level of education to practice as a professional Registered Nurse. Traditional campus based BSN programs take 4 years to complete and curriculums contain courses not included in Associate Degree in Nursing programs including courses in leaderships and management, community health nursing, risk reduction, and disease management. Graduates of BSN degree programs have greater career options than Associate degree nurses. They also have the ability to achieve specialty certification, and have the educational background to prepare them for graduate programs in nursing or healthcare administration.
