Trophy was actually derived from a Greek word. "Tropaion" was taken from the verb "trope," meaning "to rout." Trophies were considered symbols of victory in war battles back in ancient Greece. People used to make them on the battlegrounds of victorious battles, with the bases carved with the details of the fight and a dedication to the god they believed assisted them in winning the battle.

In ancient Rome, trophies were extremely large and were frequently placed on columns and arches. Rather than being a homage to the victors and the gods on the battlefield, the Romans preferred them built in Rome.

No one knew a great deal about its history during the Middle Ages. Although it is believed that they were used as accolades for sporting events in the late 1600s. Silver chalices, as well as two-handled sterling cups, were the common shapes used during that period.

Trophies are probably the supreme representation of success. The bigger the trophy, the higher the accomplishment. They are everywhere, from the largest of competitions, such as major sports events, to the smallest of matches, such as a Spelling Bee competition for elementary pupils.

Today, trophies come in various types and sizes. Although cups and chalices are still common, they now come in almost every shape imaginable, such as stars, human forms, abstract, and animal forms.

Rather than silver and gold, materials used today include steel, pewter, crystal, and plastic. They are a great deal less costly and can be mass created.

Aside from sports, trophies are also awarded in acknowledgment of an individual or group accomplishment. Example is from the Hollywood major awards event The Academy Awards, where individual talents (acting, directing, producing, etc.) and group efforts (film, cast, etc.) are recognized with a stylized human award.

A trophy is not just a reward for a particular accomplishment, be it in sports, acting, discovery, and other areas. It symbolizes victory and status.
