After researching various cheap web hosts, you will often find that the cheaper services only provide minimal support staff in customer service, and technical support, whereas other cheap web host may not even have a budget at all to train such personnel. These budget web hosts will prove to be unreliable and will perform too slowly for your business needs, so they should be avoided by all means.
