Virginia Beach Web Design: Make This a Part of Your Practical Web Design Checklist

After meeting with a number of Virginia Beach web designer, here is the compressed Virginia Beach Web Design checklist.

1. Content presentation- Other web companies have already placed emphasis on colors, layout and the like, but Virginia Beach Web Design focuses first on content and content presentation. When presenting a website's text, it is best to use common fonts such as Times New Roman and Arial. It is also important to apply a web accepted writing style- one that uses proper headings, bullet points, short sentences, short paragraphs, and a conscious use of white space. Fonts, font sizes and font colors must be consistent at all times, and do not change around a lot. Make sure content is laid out in an organized manner, which makes information easy to find. Timelines should be equally accurate, stating the date of the last copyright as well as the last revision of the website. There should be a consistent effort in making sure content is relevant and not outdated. Before the site goes live, all content must be checked and edited if they are indeed free from spelling and grammatical errors. Your content must also provide links to other relevant sites, and these links should be presented seamlessly, staying away from words like "click here".

2. Functionality- Any website must function correctly, executing all commands as they are meant to do. Website designers must see to it that all hyperlinks work, both internal and external hyper links. Also, all forms have to function as expected. Lastly, it is expected that no javascript errors are generated in a user's experience with the site.

3. Accessibility- The final point to tackle is accessibility. If the website uses flash or images as its main navigation, the designer should see to it that clear text links can be found at the bottom part of the page. There should always be the incorporation of navigation aids such as site map and skip navigation link. Image tags should not be forgotten as well. If graphics and media are used to configure meaning, then there must always be a written explanation or alternate next present, just in case the reader does not understand, or the image fails to load. Attributes such as title and summary can should also be put in when applicable in order to improve accessibility.

Remember that the consistent message of any business website must be clear at all times, and must be presented in a manner that is easiest for the visitor to understand and get to!
